## **English Presentations for Engineers Workshop 2023**

## **Fundamentals of Academic & Product Presentations for Engineering Students**

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Many engineering students and researchers do not initially realize the extent to which English ability, particularly **skills for delivering technical presentations**, will be required as they pursue their careers in both industry and academia. Whether it be at an **international academic conference**, or communicating with foreign clients for an industrial company, **being able to competently deliver a presentation in English has become an indispensable skill set for engineers in an increasingly globalizing world.** 



Unfortunately, there are limited opportunities for students to develop these highly specialized skills in a classroom setting, and engineers find themselves having to learn as they go in highly stressful "sink or swim" real-world situations. In fact, giving a presentation in English is often reported to be one of the most stressful and difficult tasks for engineers in Japan.

In order to address this issue, the EERC at Yamaguchi University is offering the short course "English Presentations for Engineers" to **graduate students and researchers who wish to improve their English presentation skills.** The course curriculum and textbook were specifically tailored to address the needs of engineers giving technical presentations, and the classes offer **individualized support from a native instructor with experience in teaching at industrial companies in Japan.** Through active participation and goal-oriented teamwork, the course aims to develop the following:

- Vocabulary and expressions relevant to giving technical presentations, including describing data, explaining processes, and presenting visual information
- Communication strategies for dealing with Q&A sessions and participating in formal and informal discussions
- Skills related to making effective presentation materials and public speaking
- Interact with others of different disciplines and broaden one's general scientific knowledge



The course will be conducted over an eight-week period starting October 16th, and the deadline to apply is 10/13. Classes will be held face-to-face on **Monday** from **12:50~14:20**. Students who enroll in this course will create and deliver a short presentation in English about their current research activities on the final day of class. All graduate students, regardless of their skill level, are encouraged to attend. Don't miss this valuable opportunity to improve your professional English skills!
